

# Significant Impacts of Grassroots Recovery Coalitions

2018 – Formation of Central Washington Recovery Coalition



1973 – Alano Club formed (only community-based recovery organization)



2019 – CWRC became regional inviting Grant & Okanogan to join

2019 – Chelan-Douglas CPTS Strategic Plan Development leading to funding of RC Coordinator



2020 – Thriving Together NCW hired Recovery Coach Coordinator

2021 – Alano Club received funding from HCA to transition to RCO & for improved space



2021 – First Narcan Vending Machines in WA state placed in NCW  
126 lives saved reported to date

2022 – 2 Recovery Coaches selected to serve on Local Boards of Health



40+ Recovery Coaches employed in North Central WA

2024 – HCA Round table on NCW reentry work in preparation for MTP 2.0



2024 – First Advanced Recovery Coach Training taught by CCAR with 30 participants

2021 – Recovery Navigator Program launched in NCW (13+ Recovery Coaches providing services)



2022 – Jail recovery coaches invited to be a resource for drug court participants

2021 – Advance NW formed community-based care coordination hub for reentry population



2021 – NCACH contracted with three organizations to fund 3.5 FTE for Recovery



2024 – Recovering Out Loud: 90 min regional recovery documentary in production



2023 – ED Recovery Coach Pilot in Grant County
